Dear Friends and Colleagues:

I'm at it again. For some of you, this is my seventh annual shameless request for a tax deductible donation. In the first six years, donations from more than 200 friends and colleagues have brought my total to more than \$32,000. Last year alone, donors helped me raise more than \$8,500, reaching the "Heavy Hitter" level (>\$6,700) for a second year.

Back in April, 2004 I began training to ride in the 25th annual Pan-Massachusetts Challenge. That August, I joined my brother and nearly 4,000 other cyclists for the two day, 190 mile bicycle ride across Massachusetts. Now, over the previous 30 years, the PMC has raised \$270 million for cancer research and treatment for the Boston based Dana-Farber Cancer Institute. Last year alone, despite the tough economy, some 5,000 of us raised \$30 million from 250,000 donors like you. *Every penny* of the money raised by riders went to the Dana-Farber. This year, nearly 5,200 cyclists have registered so far to ride. Our goal: \$31 million!

My original incentive for getting back in shape to ride in the PMC was the death in 2002 of my sister, Arlene, ending a four year dance with breast cancer. Since then, I've encountered so many people who have lost loved ones, and numerous others who overcame their own personal experience with cancer. In 2006, I added another reason to ride. One of my nieces, Laura, was diagnosed with an aggressive type of liver cancer that often emerges after a form of eye cancer she had been successfully treated for years ago. Until last summer, she had still been defying the odds, but late last year I had to say goodbye to her, too.

So now, for a 7th year, I will be riding in the PMC (Aug 7th & 8th) to again honor those whose lives ended early because of cancer, to help further research and treatment efforts so that more may live, and to celebrate those who are still with us because of the many advances that have been made in treatment.
